TRUMANSBURG ROTARY MEETING MINUTES FOR October 26th, 2023

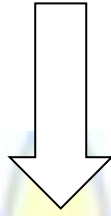
- + President Durand thanked Kathleen for a delicious meal.

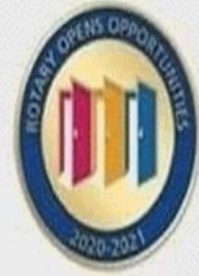
