exemplifies our global reach in promoting peace and understanding.



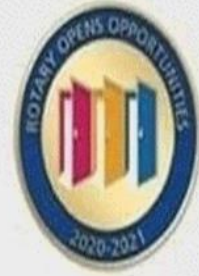
